



When Johnson Matthey refurbished their Hatton Garden offices, KI's lateral filing and storage answered three key needs - strength, modularity and design co-ordination.

The heart of the problem facing Johnson Matthey was an old fashioned collection of veneered tambour cabinets housing thousands of live archive files. The filing cupboards were simply not strong enough for the job.

Sanchez Crespo Design specified the KI system to provide the new filing solution. Partner David Boocock says '...we know the quality of KI's steel construction and recommended Johnson Matthey switched to the KI system...' KI were able to contribute to the scheme in other ways.

With a flexible modular design, the need for combination display/filing units was achieved simply.

Point of sale materials are displayed behind toughened glass doors, whilst the lower half of the units hold videos and lateral filing. Veneered tops, matching the desks, are used on lower height KI units to provide additional workspace. Management offices, with glass fronted bookcases and lateral filing are features of KI's storage systems. The bow fronted design provides differentiation from the KI 700 Series used in the general office, whilst co-ordinating in design and capability. In colour too, KI were able to help Johnson Matthey. Finished to match a RAL colour, the KI cabinets co-ordinate with the floor coverings. An important feature of KI's solution is the ability to match any colour in any quantity with no impact on leadtime, cost or continuity of supply .
